Climate catastrophe and biodiveristy loss are the consequences of unrestrained taking by humans. Might cultivation of gratitude be part of the solution?'

The quotes above are from an inspiring book, The Serviceberry, An Economy of Gifts and Abundance, 2024, by Robin Wall Kimmerer, author of the bestselling Braiding Sweetgrass. Robin is 'a mother, scientist, decorated professor and enrolled member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation'.

The book is beautifully woven around the picking of a 'pail' (yes, it's American) of serviceberries. Highly recommended!
